**HABITAT CELEBRATES HOME DEDICATIONS
TOMORROW!!**

Memphis, TN – This Saturday, four deserving Memphis-area families truly will have a place to call “home” for the first time, as Habitat for Humanity of Greater Memphis celebrates the completion of four brand new homes on Jennette Place in Memphis’ LeMoyné West neighborhood. Memphis Habitat has nine other homes in the immediate vicinity.

The ceremony will kick off at 2:00 p.m. The dedication will be followed by a block party for the new homeowners, sponsors, volunteers and neighborhood friends. All festivities will take place near the home at 648 Jennette Place (see attached map). Snacks and drinks will be provided for all guests, and games and activities will be available for children.

The Habitat Spring Building Blitz started on Friday, March 16. Spring home sponsors include Bolton High School, Briarcrest Christian School, Cargill, Cummins, Cordova High School, FedEx, First Assembly Christian School, Germantown High School, Germantown Presbyterian Church, Germantown United Methodist Church, Houston High School, International Paper, Medtronic Sofamor Danek, Millington Central High School, New Fellowship Ministries, Northwest Airlines, Primacy Relocation, St. Benedict at Auburndale High School, St. George’s Episcopal Church, St. Mary’s Episcopal School, Stewart-Jackson Pharmacal, Tennessee Valley Authority, Wells Fargo Financial and White Station High School. Habitat for Humanity is a nonprofit, ecumenical Christian housing ministry dedicated to eliminating poverty housing. Memphis Habitat has built 290 homes since its founding in 1983. Habitat houses are built with volunteer labor and sold to partner families, at no profit and with no interest charged. Partner families make a down payment and invest hundreds of hours of “sweat equity” into the construction of their homes and other Habitat homes.
